Artist Biography George Kalantzes

George Kalantzes is a landscape / nature photographer whose artwork depicts the quiet beauty found within the grand landscapes of the American West. Simple, intimately composed images are key characteristics of his work. He is a self-taught photographer who embarked on a professional landscape photography career in 2014.

George devotes a considerable amount of time studying and educating himself on traditional and contemporary elements of photography. Most recently, in 2024 he published Musings in Monochrome.

George is currently represented by Gallery 873 at the Kayenta Arts Village in Ivins, Utah. The Frame Garden Gallery and Livingston Center for Arts & Culture in Livingston, Montana. He is actively seeking gallery representation in the Bozeman, Montana regional arts market.

George's photography is collected by private individuals and commercial clients. His work has appeared on the app for the Bozeman International Film Festival. He has licensed images on display at the Cannery District (Bozeman, MT); Livingston HealthCare; and Benefis Health System (Great Falls, MT).
